Biography: Dr. Harold W. Henning, a participant in this meet from Lockport, NY, was selected as the 1985 recipient of the Joseph G. Rogers Award. Born in 1919, he joined the Lockport YMCA at the age of 9 and took swimming lessons from Captain George Corsan from the Royal Life Guard Service in Canada. Captain Corson visited YMCAs throughout the United States conducting "Learn to Swim Campaigns." Harold's first competitive meet occurred following those lessons at the YMCA in a 20 yard pool. He was pulled out of the race after about 10 yards and indicated that "perhaps my faith exceeded my capabilities as a swimmer". Harold participated in the National Championship Meet(s) representing both the Lockport Y and then the Naperville Y when he moved to Naperville, Illinois. He became the 1st swimmer to represent the Naperville Y in a national meet. He was an All American in freestyle and backstroke but he never competed in the Olympics. He once swam on a World Record 400 Meter Freestyle Relay Team for the Chicago Town Club. Harold also served 12 years as a volunteer swimming coach for North Central College. Harold Henning was a dentist by profession for 39 years, but swimming dominated his life. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1942 thru 1945 as an instructor in Aquatic Warfare. Harold served as Chairman of the U.S. Olympic Committee from 1959 thru 1965. He was manager and coach of the United States Olympic Swimming Team that competed in Mexico, Guatemala and Japan, and he served as manager of the U.S. Swimming team in Tokyo in 1964. He became well known in 1973 for opposing the efforts of the International Olympic Committee, then headed by Avery Brundage, to drop 12 swimming events from the Olympics. Harold was the President of the International Amateur Swimming Federation, the group that promotes and protects swimming, diving and water polo throughout the world, from 1972 thru 1976. Dr. Harold Henning is also a member of the International Swimming Hall of Fame. Harold was a continuous and dedicated member of his YMCA for 50 years. Dr. Harold W. Henning passed away May 23, 1988. *His Rogers Award is on display at the Naperville YMCA
