Special Event: After the finals at 10:00 PM. a *Victory Dance* was held under the Auspices of the 19UP Club Committee. Dr. Graydon Powell, Fred Hayes, Norman Swette and Larry Schmidt coordinated the program and the music was provided by the Gene Eves Orchestra. At 11:00 PM. awarding of the medals and trophies took place in the Olympic manner.

FEES: \$1.00 per individual for four persons or less, \$5.00 per association with from five to eight representatives and 50c for each additional man for associations with more than eight entries, must accompany the entry blank.

PRIZES: YMCA National Championship medals of gold, silver, and bronze were awarded the first, second and third place winner in each event, relays included. A permanent trophy was awarded the team scoring the highest number of points.

RULES: The Principles and Rules governing competitive physical activities in the Young Men's Christian Association of the United States effective January 1, 1937, governed the eligibility of contestants of this meet. The National Collegiate Athletic Association rules governed the conduct of the swimming events of the meet, with the exception of the order of events which was the same as last year. Qualifications for swimming events were on a time basis in all events except the 50 yard dash. The International Amateur Federation diving rules governed the diving events. Competitors were not permitted to wear any other than Y insignia on any part of their swimming costume or sweat clothes. No contestant was permitted to use the name of, or represent any organization other than the YMCA of which he was a member. Tank suits must be worn. "Trunks" were not permitted.

SCORING: Relays—First place 10 points; second place, 8 points; third place, 6 points; fourth place, 4 points; fifth place 2 points. **All other events-** First place 6 points; second place, 4 points; third place, 3 points; fourth place, 2 points; fifth place, 1 point.

<u>REGISTRATION</u>: All contestants presented their YMCA registration cards, the number of which appeared on the entry blank.

INFORMATION: The Lake Shore A.C. Pool is 75 ft. x 35 ft. with seven lanes. The diving board was regulation one meter above twelve feet of water. The water was 4 feet 6 inches at the shallow end and 9 feet at the deep end. A list of 5 optional dives accompanied the contestant's entry blank. Any desired change in these optional dives was made in writing before Friday May 7 at 10:00 AM.

ENTRIES: Addressed to Loris A. Hoyt, Lawson YMCA, 30 West Chicago Ave., Chicago, Illinois. All entries had to be received by Monday, May 3. Entries posted Monday May 3, and received at a later date were accepted. The committee reserved the right to decline any entry.

CHAMPIONSHIP COMMITTEE: The Championship Committee held its official meeting for the purpose of passing upon the eligibility of associations and individuals and considering all matters pertaining to the proper conduct of the championship on May 6 at 6:00 PM. All information bearing upon the eligibility of associations and individuals was presented to Thomas K. Cureton, Chairman of the Championship Committee before Thursday May 6, at 6:00 PM.

COACHES MEETING: The Coaches met with the Championship Committee at 8:00 P.M. Thursday May 6. for the purpose of arranging heats, etc.

Four men from each team may be entered in any one event. No Contestant may participate in more than three events including relays.

May 6th Coaches Meeting Agenda Items:

1. Motion made and carried that drawing for lanes and heats would be conducted at this meeting.

2. A lengthy discussion took place regarding a request that divers be allowed to wear swim trunks. This would be a change from the rules as written for the meet however, it was agreed that trunk suits should worn.

3. Questions regarding dual representation came up and were addressed. An explanation and a definition was given that answered those questions.

4. Chairman Cureton talked about getting AAU recognition and sanction of the meet for American records as well as National YMCA records being established.

Mr. Cureton stressed the importance of having coaches meetings in order to discuss any problems and to make recommendations to improve the hosting and the conduct of the National Swimming and Diving Championships. Suggestions and recommendations then could be given directly to Dr. John Brown Jr., the head of the National YMCA Physical Committee who was in attendance at this year's meet.

Dr. Brown in turn explained the process by which suggestions and or recommendations made by sub-committees were submitted to the National YMCA Physical Education Committee for action.

May 8th Coaches Meeting Agenda Items:

1. NCAA Rules: After much discussion, Mr. R.H. Cheadle-Montclair, NJ, made the following motion which was seconded by Mr. Bill O'Neill-Canton, OH and passed unanimously passed.

Motion: That the coaches group represented at the 15th YMCA National Swimming recommend to the National Swimming Committee that our National YMCA Swimming Championships be conducted according to National Collegiate Athletic Association rules including the Order of events with the option that the National Swimming Committee be allowed to exclude any event because of equipment limitations.

2. Coaches Association: There was a lengthy discussion concerning the establishment of a YMCA Coaches Association. However, because there was to be a National YMCA Aquatic Conference scheduled later this year any action in relation to the formation of this Coaches Association should be delayed until after the conference.

3. International/ National: Over the past few years there has been a misunderstanding regarding the title for this YMCA Championship meet—

"International" or "National". After a coherent explanation by Dr. Brown a motion by Mr. Stewart McCutcheon of the Lawson Branch and seconded by Mr. Plunkett of the Brooklyn Central Branch passed unanimously. Motion:

That the policy of the National Physical Education Committee be followed by calling the championship "National."

4. College/High School swimmers: Bill O'Neill of the Canton Central YMCA brought up the matter of importing college or high school swimmers to swim the National Championships. A membership requirement discussion followed. Mr. O'Neill suggested the membership requirement should be changed from one month to six months. Dr. Brown asked that the coaches present take a straw vote—show of hands for 1 month---4 coaches voted "yes"; 6 months----16 of those present voted "yes". Thus it was the sentiment of a majority of coaches present that the national principles and rules that govern competitive physical activities in the Young Mens

Christian Association of the United States in the section defining eligibility rules for individuals should be revised to read " has been a bonafide member of the association at least six months preceding date of events entered." At this time it was 4:30 PM and the meeting had to adjourn in order to continue the Saturday afternoon preliminaries.
